PAPANOK A LAKITAN (MESSENGER BIRD) NILO ALACALA

Nilo Alcala (b. 1978) is among the most popular Filipino composers of his generation. Among his works that is frequently performed is Papanok a Lakitan. Based on a chant from Maguindanao, a province in the southern part of the Philippines, this work was originally set for SATB with optional percussion. This polyrhythmic and polymodal piece mimics the sound of gongs, known as kulintang, very similar to the metallophones in a gamelan ensemble. The onomatopoeic elements are mostly sung by the altos, tenors, and basses. This piece is suitable for advanced high school choirs and college-level choirs and would be a great feature piece for a concert. An SSAA version is also available.
